# Tireless Tigers

Glenelg and Norwood, like worn out gladiators, showed what desperation was about at the Bay yesterday before the Tigers triumphed by 13 points.

Norwood lost no respect as it was without 12 players who have played league this season, and then lost back pocket Wayne Schmaal with a strained knee in the third term.

Follower Keith Thomas was forced to withdraw from the side with a virus.

Others missing were Jim Thiel, Danny Jenkins, Paul Adler, Greg Turbill, Bruce Winter, Joe Ahmat, Lester Ross, Duncan Fosdike, Phil Gallagher, Trevor Murano and John Gallagher.

To lose by only 13 points with such heavy casualties and be within winning reach throughout the game, spoke volumes for the Red-legs' character.

But nothing should be taken away from Glenelg's victory as it rode the hard bumps in a physically demanding contest and refused to wilt under the extreme pressure.

Neither side produced its best football. The relentless pressure and fierce tackling prevented that.

But it was indeed an absorbing contest.

The turning point for the Tigers was a goal by centreman David Marshall, set up by Alan Stringer, at the 21-minute mark of the second term.

Another three goals in three minutes gave them an eight-point lead at half-time and Norwood could not combat Glenelg's sudden lift in confidence.

What made Norwood's task greater was a goal-less third term and 10 consecutive points from the 12-minute mark of the second term until early in the last.

Norwood's score of 10-15 was the first time this season it kicked more points than goals.

Glenelg, too, was off target, preventing it from escaping the Norwood pressure.

Marshall was brilliant. With 24 hard earned kicks and seven handballs, he consistently forced the Tigers into attack and bypassed Norwood's "new look" defence.

He received enormous support from Chris Duthy on a wing, backed up by Wayne Stringer, while Stephen Kernahan once again provided the power in ruck.

Alan Stringer played his best game for Glenelg across half-forward, while others who shone included forward Tony Hall and follower Chris McDermott.

McDermott was expected to play a shadowing role on Michael Aish throughout the match, but Glenelg coach Graham Campbell did not give him that task until the last 10 minutes when Aish looked as if he was going to put the Red-legs in front.

Wingman Andrew Aish played a fine game for Norwood, not far ahead of full back Tom Warhurst, who consistently thwarted attacks.
