Glenelg climbed from sixth to third position on the league premiership table with an easy 47-point win against South Adelaide in the late match at Football Park yesterday.

South slid from fifth to sixth place because of its fourth consecutive loss and fifth in its last six games, after starting the season with three straight victories — against Glenelg, North Adelaide and West Adelaide.

Glenelg also had good news from Glenelg Oval, where John Fidge kicked 12 of Glenelg reserves' 23 goals in their 49-point defeat of South reserves.

Full forward Fidge had missed the past three games with a badly bruised foot.

He is certain to reclaim his league spot against the Eagles at Glenelg Oval on Saturday.

Glenelg is not short of forward options. Mark Russell, at full forward, and Craig Budarick, in a pocket, combined well yesterday to provide a dual focal point for Glenelg's attacks.

Russell booted four goals and Budarick made a spectacular comeback from the re

serves, getting seven goals from eight kicks.

Yesterday's success was the Tigers' fifth in nine matches, and sweet revenge for their 52-point loss to South at Glenelg Oval in the opening series.

The Panthers torpedoed their chances with inaccurate kicking for goal — 8.17, including 0.8 in the third quarter.

But Glenelg always was travelling like a winner, leading throughout, finishing powerfully and often giving the impression it was on a training gallop, so arrogantly and contemptuously did players gather and dispose of the ball.

South again gave the impression of having too many players merely going through the motions and that was nowhere near good enough against a confident, energetic Glenelg side that is headed for the finals.

South's woes aside, the most disturbing aspect of the day was the small crowd of 5373 — on a fine day when Central District and Sturt had played the curtainraiser.

A year or so ago, double-

headers were tipped as one of the salvations of the local competition.

This is no longer the case, based on the small crowds they have attracted this season.

Eagles may move

Woodville-West Torrens has not ruled out the possibility of a return to Woodville Oval — as early as next year.

Sturt has denied a report that it was looking at making a return to Unley Oval.

The Eagles are considering their choices and plan to survey members soon on a possible move away from Football Park.

It is believed the club could shift one of its Football Park "home" matches to Woodville later this year to "test the market".

Eagles general manager Mr Geoff Hosking said yesterday the club was "open-minded" about the situation.

"Obviously over the last couple of years times have changed with the advent of the Crows," Mr Hosking said. "You can't stop looking at various options that may benefit you as a club.

"In the not-too-distant future we'll be surveying members to ascertain what their views are so we can take that into consideration."

Representatives of the SA National Football League Commission, the nine league clubs and Adelaide Football Club will discuss strategies for the future of SA league football at a conference at Football Park on July 27.

More flexible programming and a shorter season, including a reduced pre-season competition, are among the issues to be discussed.
