Norwood falls to clinical Glenelg

Glenelg, boasting superior workrate and an efficient midfield, notched its fifth straight win with a committed, clinical performance against Norwood at the Parade.

The 20-point success elevated the Tigers to third place on the SANFL ladder and underlined their growing reputation as a premiership contender.

"Beating Norwood at Norwood was always one of the most satisfying wins for me as a player," Glenelg coach Mark Williams said afterwards. "I hope the players appreciate the moment."

Glenelg, after absorbing Norwood's regular forays into attack early, was never headed after ruckman Tony Redshaw booted its first goal after 15 minutes of the first quarter.

Chris Prime's third goal for Norwood midway through the third quarter levelled the scores after a spirited Redleg fightback. But the home team could not register another six-pointer until Prime kicked his fourth approaching time-on of the last quarter. By then Glenelg had regrouped and established a match-winning lead.

The Tigers had more runners, more workers and a superior defence. They are playing with such confidence they must be favored to inflict the Eagles' third straight defeat next week-end at the Bay.

Back pocket Richard Kelly, wingman Todd Davey, ruckman Jonathon Robran, forward Sam Smart, half-back Scott Burns and captain Garry McIntosh struggled gamely all day for Norwood, but they were outnumbered by the visitors' many four-quarter contributors.

McIntosh was reported for misconduct during a third-quarter incident with Glenelg skipper Nick Chigwidden who, after a relatively quiet opening half exploded into action in the third and last quarters.

Along with fellow runners Craig McRae, Simon Hele, Brett Deane, Darren

Mansell and Phil McGuinness, he tore Norwood's defence apart in the final stanza when the game could have gone either way.

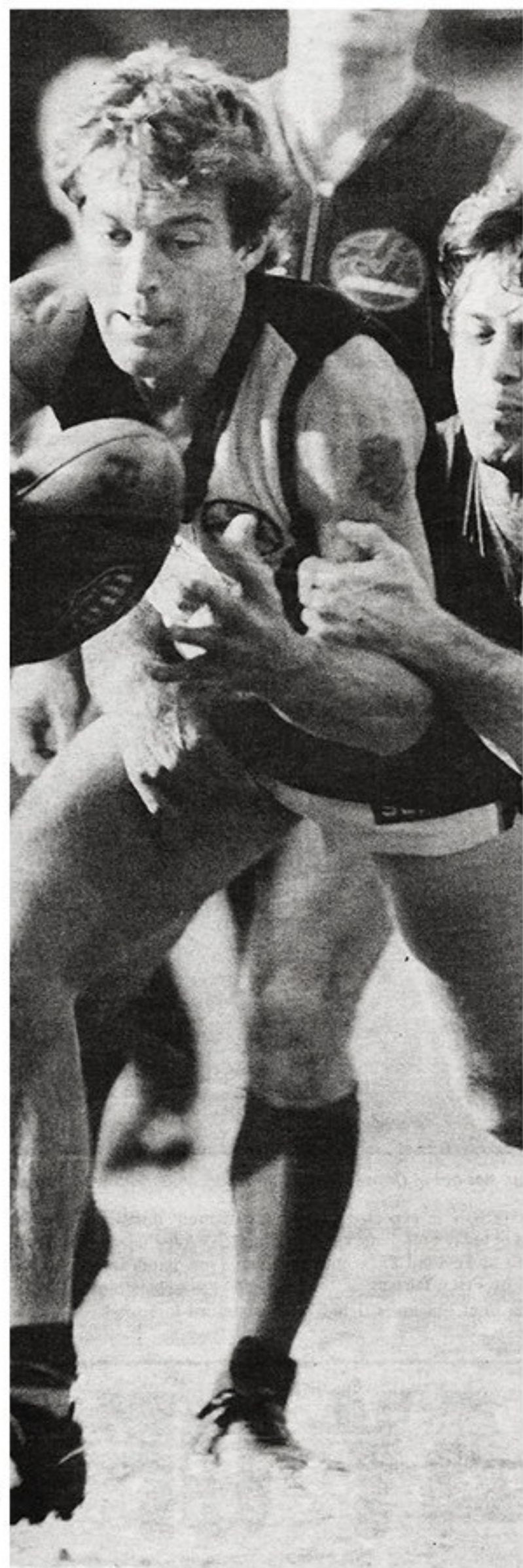
The Tigers also were admirably served by ruckman Stewart McCully and tough, defender Peter Berbakov.

Adelaide Crow Mark Viska also was outstanding across half-back. He will, however, have X-rays on a thumb he damaged in a last quarter marking contest.

Fellow Crow Matthew Robran showed glimpses of brilliance but did not have a significant impact.

Norwood appeared to have created the necessary momentum for success when it booted 4.1 in the first 16 minutes of the second half to draw level.

But Glenelg steadied, edged to an eight-point lead at the final change and destroyed Norwood with its running game in a superb last quarter.
