EVEN North Adelaide coach Josh Francou branded it a train wreck.

If you're only as good as your last dig, Glenelg looked every bit the real deal in disposing of North Adelaide by 56 points at Prospect yesterday.

But at the other end, Roosters fans had better buckle up for another hellish season.

Of course, it's too early for bold statements - especially talking up Glenelg in April - but there was plenty to like for the Tigers faithful and new full-time coach Kris Massie.

Crows-listed Jarryd Lyons (30 disposals, 13 clearances) was brilliant in a Glenelg midfield that decimated a timid North Adelaide, and gave himself every chance for consideration for a debut AFL call-up.

Power pair Steven Salopek and Jason Davenport offered poise and class all day, skipper Ty Allen was his typical hard-working self, Lachy Button was impressive in the ruck and Andrew Bradley was a sparkplug in the middle.

Ben Reid benefited from a steady stream of Tigers attacks, finishing with three goals, and Lewis Hender booted two before drifting out in the second half.

At 2-0, Massie was reluctant

to get too excited too early with his Glenelg side.

"Reasonably pleased," he said. "There are some areas we can do better.

"There were a couple of times we could've been more direct, but outside that it was pretty positive."

As a contest, it looked like getting ugly early as Glenelg stormed away from the outset.

By the time Allen weaved past five North Adelaide defenders on the 50m line and strolled into open goal midway through the second term, it was out to 42 points and the only question left was "by how much?"

As good as the Tigers looked, North looked abysmal.

As far as Roosters went, they made decent headless chooks.

In captain James Allan's 100th game, poor decisions and worse disposal in the midfield led to an endless string of turn-overs that hurt them horribly.

In the first quarter alone, North trailed in inside-50s 16-4.

Lewis Johnston ended with three goals, Allan was typically busy and Matt Wright and Cohen Thiele never threw in the towel.

But there was no sugar-coating this one.

"Non-competitive, hapless, didn't cope with Glenelg's pres-

sure or perceived pressure, turned the footy over," Francou said.

"Inspid effort. That's how I sum it up.

"When you don't challenge a side that is putting pressure on you, that's what happens.

"The really gut-wrenching feeling from that is, that's not what we're all about and it's not what I want this club to be seen as - but we did it today.

"It was just like a train wreck."
